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SCHOOL COUNSELING CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENTS

The graduate certification in School Counseling is designed for individuals who have a Master's degree in Counseling from a CACREP-accredited institution (or equivalent) in an emphasis other than school counseling. This certification program provides post-graduate training in the emphasis area of school counseling to students who have completed a Master's in Counseling in a different emphasis. Program Requirements

Courses would be taken sequentially to address the development of counseling services K-12. The internship will be one or two semesters (600 hours), depending on the needs of the student, as determined by Counselor Education faculty. Experience in all three areas (Elementary and Secondary levels) will be required.
